

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

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

If you are headed Downtown on a Saturday or Sunday this holiday season, remember you can park for free in one of the city's five parking structures. Highly recommend is the parking garage located at 15th and Pearl streets. Our "insider tip" is to head to one of the structure's underground levels. While people look for spaces on the upper decks, you will have a plethora of options to choose from underground (where there is tons of room and plenty of light)! This location has over 686 spots - including 14 accessible spaces (height 7'2") available. From this garage, you will find yourself just steps away from the Pearl Street Mall as well as some fantastic retail, restaurants and service businesses located on the beautiful East End between 15th and 21st streets.

You will find another parking jewel at 10th and Walnut streets, below the St. Julien

Hotel. Again, on weekends parking in this lot is free! There are more than 650 parking spots underneath Downtown's newest hotel, and when you exit the structure you will find yourself on bustling Walnut Street, just a block from Pearl Street & the West End. These two parking garages are excellent alternatives to the bustling structure at 11th and Spruce streets (an "insider tip" just for you)!

For a quick visit, find street parking and a conveniently located pay station (which accepts both coins and credit cards). You can park (and move) anywhere on the streets of Downtown within the allotted time you purchase...just make sure to keep your ticket stub visible. ("Insider tip": you are allotted a five minute grace period once your time expires!) If you are spending a day in Boulder (and have things to do and people to see in other parts of the city), consider the HOP bus into or out of Downtown. You can HOP between Downtown, the Hill, the University of Colorado and the Twenty Ninth Street Shopping District. The bus schedule runs approximately every 15 minutes on the weekends. Look for Hop Stops along Pearl, Spruce and Walnut streets. Weekend fares run \$1.75 (Eco Pass holders ride for free)!






Since 1988, the Downtown Management Commission (DMC) manages, controls and supervises the business affairs of the Pearl Street Mall and the Central Area General Improvement District (CAGID),a 35 block area in Downtown Boulder. The five member Commission is appointed by Boulder's City Council and meets monthly with their director and staff to review policies, programs and operations.

DMC citizen-at-large, Matt McMullen served on the University Hill General Improvement District for five years before joining the DMC team. He is one of five members which help plan and oversee the DMC's goals. Looking towards the future, McMullen says the DMC hopes to continue enhancing parking technology; build new parking structures and

Trevino notes, "The positive thing is that I am able to run my business and work on my clients while putting cancer on the back burner." In September (national ovarian cancer awareness month), West End Salon participated by donating five percent of all retail sales for the month to ovarian cancer research. All of the stylists contributed by donating five percent of their service sales as well. ## Eric Skokan of Black Cat

You first notice the intimate space with nouveau chandeliers hanging from the ceiling, comfortable banquettes lining the walls and tables separated by thin white muslin curtains, contributing to its cozy feel. The real centerpiece is appropriately the kitchen; a minuscule narrow corridor overlooking the forty-two seats where diners gaze back on the intent work of Chef Eric Skokan and his crew. In this hidden gem off Pearl Street, where amber light ebbs and flows nightly with distinct sounds resonating from the galley, Chef Skokan delivers his eclectic Frenchinfluenced fare at Black Cat (1964 13th St.). With only half the capacity of the average fine dining establishment, the Black Cat space allows Chef Skokan the opportunity to bring his vision of Colorado cuisine to lucky patrons in Downtown.

Skokan grew up spending weekends canning tomatoes, peaches and corn on his grandparents' farm in upstate New York. It never occurred to him that this wasn't how other kids experienced food. He now cares for his own acre garden behind his North Boulder home, where he (and his children) can be found picking the freshest ingredients for the restaurant. His home garden is the first wave in his process to uncover what Colorado cuisine truly means, where everything from beans, greens and fennel flowers make it directly onto the plates in the restaurant. After 15 years in kitchens across America, the values and tastes of the family farm, as well as his passion about ingredients and flavors are evident in the impeccable meals prepared nightly at the Black Cat.

to the iconic Restaurant Nora in Washington D.C., - the first certified organic restaurant in the nation. "Back then nobody knew what organic meant," recalled Skokan. It was during his time at Restaurant Nora where he experienced a creative way to operate a kitchen by building relationships with purvevors and finding the best ingredients, even if it meant buying mushrooms from seven different people. "Ordering was a challenging job," he said, but one that taught me the importance of freshness and flavor." After Nora, Skokan found himself on the other coast, in San Francisco, at

Valentines, a vegetarian café that changed his view of food from the classic French mantra of "fat is flavor" to modern cuisine's trap of "height is flavor." He then realized his current mantra of "flavor is flavor," and the technique clicked for him. Skokan's interest in healthy, organic and flavorful food attracted the attention of the Gold Lake Resort's Alice's Restaurant near Ward, Colorado. Upon his first visit he fell in love with the Rocky Mountains and spent the next eight years in the high country before coming to Downtown to bestow his vision of Centennial State cuisine on the discerning diners in Boulder.

Chef Skokan is extremely proud of his progress in creating a local network of sup-

While studying colonial history at the University of Virginia, Skokan spent weekends supporting himself as innkeeper and defacto chef at a small country inn. Left alone with a wall of cookbooks, he cooked his way through all of them. By the time he left college his passion for cooking was paramount and led him

pliers. "It took Nora 15 years and she was on the bleeding edge of change," he noted. Skokan hopes over the next two years he can cultivate individual relationships with his purveyors. He already has a head start with the Boulder Culinary Gardeners Group, five or six home gardeners who each grow something

for his kitchen from chard to carrots. By immersing himself in the community and developing these relationships, it's Chef Skokan's turn to be on the 'bleeding edge' of change making life easier for those who follow his lead.

When he's not in the kitchen or garden, Chef Skokan is with his family, enjoying time together and passing on his passion of food and farming to the next generation. Most evenings, he can be found at the helm of his inspired restaurant delighting the palates of Downtown patrons. Skokan believes that, "Downtown Boulder is unusual in the culinary world, offering an atmosphere of community unlike others. Our heart and soul is right on these few blocks and it gives all of us a common identity." With Chef Skokan's help, this identity may just lead us to discover the exquisiteness of our own local gastronomy.

## Pecan Crusted Rockfish with Grilled Sweet Potatoes, Cranberries and Garlic Jus from Chef Eric Skokan of Black Cat



Taking its cues from a turkey dinner, this holiday season fish dish combines deep, rich roasted flavors with the firm meatiness of rockfish, which is the mid-Atlantic name for the wild striped seabass that runs off the coast.

### Serves 6

2 bulbs of fresh garlic 1 tablespoon oil 1 quart chicken stock 2 bay leaves 3 sprigs of thyme Salt to taste 1 sweet potato, sliced into ¼ inch slices 2 tablespoons oil ¼ cup fresh cranberries 3 pounds rockfish fillet, cut into 6 pieces Salt to taste 1 ½ cups pecan pieces Pre-heat oven to 400°

1. On a baking sheet tray combine garlic and oil. Bake garlic until tender & soft and skin is golden brown. Remove from oven to cool. When cool, separate cooked cloves. Reserve.

2. In a medium pot over medium heat, combine reserved garlic and chicken stock. Reduce chicken stock by half. Add bay leaves and thyme and simmer for five minutes. Season with salt. Reserve warm.

3. Toss sweet potatoes in oil. On a gas or wood grill, cook sweet potato slices until cooked through (about five minutes).

4. In a baking sheet tray, lay out fish pieces, seasoning with salt. Bake fish in oven for five minutes. Remove fish and top with pecans. Add cranberries to baking tray with fish. Return to oven and continue baking until pecans are toasted (about three minutes).

5. To serve, divide sweet potatoes among six warmed dinner plates. Top each with one piece of rockfish. Garnish each plate with roasted cranberries, reduced chicken stock and roasted garlic cloves. Serve immediately.

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

# A Winter's Tale



Molly Winter's journey has taken her from one of the first suburbs in the country to what she calls the best job in the city of Boulder. Her definition and personal sense of community has helped put systems into place that benefit Boulder residents every day. As Director of the Downtown and University Hill Management Division and Parking Services, Winter's unique ability to address tough issues and turn them around for the benefit of the community is recognized nationally. Although trying to balance the needs of individual interests and expanding people's understanding of complex situations is never easy, Winter believes, "People who live here understand the balance of Downtown's place in the broader community." Her focus is on understanding and enriching this complex organic system for future generations to enjoy.

Born in Chicago, Winter spent her childhood living in one of the country's first suburbs, Park Forest (outside of Chicago) then New York, Iowa and even-

tually South Carolina. As a young adult she attended Hollins College in Virginia where she received a degree in Architectural History. After graduation, she migrated to Boston and worked for The Architects' Collaborative and then another design firm known for its town planning. (It was at this firm where she first met her future husband, Nore Winter.) From the design firm, Winter became involved in the Cambridge Arts Council and worked there for over a decade in a number of different positions including directing the city-run arts festival - one of the nation's most stellar celebrations.

Working at the Cambridge Arts Council allowed Winter to focus on securing community involvement in an especially ethnic and culturally diverse environment. The skills she developed there helped prepare her for her next position with Boston's City Park Zoos. At the zoos, she was responsible for coordinating community relations, fundraising and designing outreach activities. At this point in her professional life she honed in on her interests and her career focus further crystallized for her. "As you go through your life, you're led to things that are satisfying to you and hopefully those are the same ones you have skills in doing," said Winter. It was around this time that her husband (now an architect and planner) found himself in Boulder plying his trade. In 1985, Winter joined her husband in Boulder and joined the team at the Colorado Music Festival, applying her knowledge and experience in community relations, fundraising and public relations. About her time there Winter notes the Music Festival "was a fabulous opportunity and introduction to Boulder."

Once acclimated to Boulder, Winter became the director of the Downtown Partnership, a property owner organization. Over the next few years she worked with others (such as businessman Frank Day), to merge Downtown merchant and property owners organizations into one group, Downtown Boulder, Incorporated, thereby creating a unified voice. On the city side, Winter helped coordinate efforts to combine the mall commission, mall crew, and Central Area Improvement District (CAGID) advisory board into a consolidated entity known as the Downtown Management Commission. This holistic collaboration of disparate views creating a better community, became Winter's passion and trademark. The unusual bundling of community services now known as the Downtown and University Hill Management Division and Parking Services is a truly unique city department and is one of only a handful across the country.

After Winter helped pass the bond initiative for the 11th and Spruce streets parking structure she turned attention to her personal life. She and Nore started a family and then the two partnered to open Winter and Co., a consulting and design firm. After spending the next four years raising her daughter Lily and helping her husband's company, she once again felt the call to public service and applied for the director of the Downtown Management Division. At the time of her hire in 1993, the division only had two employees (a far cry from the 48 employees who work there today). Within a couple of years, Winter's division took over management of University Hill followed by overseeing parking in citywide shortly thereafter. Celebrating 15 years on the job, Winter considers herself a public server not a public servant, a distinction that is important to realize. "We are here to serve the public," she notes. "Working in local government is very satisfying because you see the fruits of your labor and have a direct connection with whom you are here to serve." planning and management field. If anyone was determined to make everyone happy, it was Molly Winter who took Secrist's goal seriously and worked with designers and other groups to meet the challenge of taking the beloved pedestrian mall and adapting it to accommodate events, vendors, pedestrians and businesses as well as locals and out-of-town visitors who come to enjoy it every day. Looking back at the outcome, Winter notes, "It was one of the most satisfying accomplishments and almost as if the improvements which were made had



This long term view came to life in the St. Julien Hotel and Spa development, the only public/ private urban renewal project in Boulder and one that Winter is extremely proud of helping come to fruition.

As she looks to the future, Winter is excited to engage in conversations and finding ways to improve life on the Hill and Downtown. One such important issue is transportation. In the very near future she hopes to maximize opportunities for bikes, transit and pedestrian modes to achieve the best the community possible. On her current position, she says, "I often feel awed by the stewardship for these public places for which I am responsible," "it is this commitment and passion that is evident in her work. In the end, Winter reminds us she is a community member too and thanks to her continued efforts, Boulder remains one of the best places to live and work in the country.


